The Schoharie CSD announced an amendment to its policy for serving meals for children served under the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program for the 2022-23 school year, which would allow for all children at all schools/sites to be served meals at no charge.

### **What does this mean for your child(ren) attending the school(s) identified above?**

All students enrolled in the Schoharie Central School District are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at school at **no charge** to your household each day of the 2022-2023 school year.

### **How Does This Help My School?**

- For every school meal served *money is returned to your school district's food budget*, from the New York State and Federal government, in order to better the food service program.
- Submitting the Household Income Eligibility form helps with your school district's overall budget.
  - By determining which children would otherwise qualify for free and reduced-priced meals, school districts are able to receive more funding.

The letter must contain the complainant's name, address, telephone number, and a written description of the alleged discriminatory action in sufficient detail to inform the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights (ASCR) about the nature and date of an alleged civil rights violation.
