Attendance Makes a Difference

Your child's teachers will do their best to help your child learn and succeed in school. But there's one thing *only you can do* - get him or her to school everyday.

Children who don't attend school regularly fall behind. They can have a hard time making and keeping friends - especially in elementary school.

Show your child and his/her teachers that you know attendance counts:

- Tell your child how important school is.
- Make dental and other appointments during non-school hours.
- Don't let your child skip school for reasons that wouldn't prevent you from going to work.
- Avoid taking your child out of school on exam days.
- Keep track of your child's absences. See if there are any patterns that need to be changed.
- Communicate with us if your child is expressing a worry about being in school so we can help address it.

Message from the Principal

We look forward to welcoming the students back on Tuesday, September 6th. There have been many upgrades to the District this summer that are hard to miss, including a paving project with a new parking lot and a brand new playground. The paving project created a safer traffic pattern, and many more parking spaces, which were very necessary. Please follow the traffic signs and directional arrows in the parking lot, as the safety of all is our top priority. The playground equipment installed this summer was purchased by the District through grant funds at no cost to the taxpayer. There is still equipment coming that was funded through an EPTSO dance-a-thon fundraiser last year. We look forward to utilizing these great additions.

We are slated to complete a Capital Project over the next two years. This project will provide our elementary school with a new library and cafeteria. It will allow us the space to have a gymnasium/auditorium which is big enough for our students and families to gather for celebrations comfortably without needing to trek through the high school.
