Attention Parents of Fifth Graders: As a reminder, NYSDOH immunization requirements state that students 11 years or older entering grade 6 are required to have one dose of Tdap. Students who are 10 years old in grade 6 are in compliance until they turn 11 years old. Please discuss with your child's health care provider to ensure that the required vaccine is administered accordingly.

If you have not provided the School Nurse with a copy of their annual physical exam for the 5th grade school year, please do so. It can be sent in with your student or faxed to 518-295-9506.
