The Schoharie Storeroom is a place for people in need to take anything they don't have for free. Students or any adult has access to the Storeroom; the students need to ask first. There are different types of clothes and items: pants, shirts, dresses, costumes, diapers, underwear, toiletries, hair brushes, hair ties, backpacks, blankets and sheets. The clothing sizes range from babies to adults. When an item is taken that item is taken off of the list. No names are needed. Anyone can donate washed or new items. The Storeroom is next to the '52 gym.

The Schoharie storeroom is important because if someone really needs something that they don't have, they can find it in there; they just have to ask. A class of high schoolers and their teachers and assistants helped out to make this happen. They organized and labeled everything there so it's easy to find what you need. They also go through new donations.

She wanted to become a teacher because she likes to be with other kids and help them learn.




One of Schoharie's Awesome Kindergarten Teachers... Mrs. Kenny!



What do you like to teach the most?


I like to teach writing because when new students come in they don't really know how to write yet. Some of their pieces are funny.

Whole class: Yes, you!


(name) Couldn't be!

What do your students play at recess?


The students play a game called "Flood," where they play on the jungle gym trying to escape the rising "water."








Mrs. Yager, the Leader of the Star-bucks Crew




It's a normal day here at Schoharie Central School, or is it? Today at Schoharie, Mrs. Bates has plans for math and science and she has awesome activities!


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BOOK REVIEWS







