
SCHOHARIE FEST






Book Fair

Talent Show



Lego Robotics with Mrs. Bikowicz

What do you do in Lego Robotics?

We build robots out of Legos and code them to move.

What is your students' favorite activity to do in Lego Robotics?


Coding

How often do you meet in Lego Robotics?

Monday: grades 3-5

As soon as I started teaching here. (This is Mrs. Bikowicz's first year teaching at Schoharie.)

2 There are three sessions per year: Fall, Winter, and Spring.


3. Three strikes and you are out of Intramurals.

Strike 3: You are out of Intramurals for the year.


4. If you don't participate in P.E. class that week, then you have to sit out of Intramurals for the day.

How many books have you read so far in the Book Club?


5 in total.

We read as a group.


Do you do activities based on the books you're reading?

Let's Read with the Book Club... with Mrs. Reynolds!



Mrs. Thalheimer: Mrs. Borst sent out an email to ask if anyone would help, so I signed up.


Mr. Toro: I Like sports.

Mrs. Thalheimer: 2 miles


Mr. Toro: 2 miles

Mario Kart


These are some fun facts about Gaming Club. Hopefully, next year we will have it again. Maybe you can join Gaming Club then, too!



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

SCHOHARIE SUPER CITIZENS!






