**Schoharie Central School District Letter to Parents
for School Meal Programs
Special Provision Options (Provision 2 Non-Base Year & Community
Eligibility Provision)**

Dear Parent or Guardian:

We are pleased to inform you that the **Schoharie Central School District** has implemented a meal certification option to our schools participating in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Program called the **Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)**. **All students enrolled at Schoharie CSD are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at school at no charge** to your household each day of the **2023-24 school year**. Your child(ren) will be able to participate in these meal programs without having to pay a fee or complete a Free or Reduced Meal Application.

What does this mean for your child(ren) attending the school(s) identified above?

All students enrolled at Schoharie CSD are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at school at **no charge** to your household each day of the 2023 - 2024 school year. Please complete the Household Income Eligibility Form securely, online at the link below:

What is the Household Income Eligibility Form?

The form collects basic information about your learner so our school can determine if they would otherwise be eligible for free or reduced-price breakfast/lunch. It is important for EVERY family to fill out this form because doing so helps bring much-needed additional money and services directly to our school! This form must be submitted each year **by October 1st**. The easiest, most secure way to submit it is to complete it online at <https://linqconnect.com/public/income-form/new?identifier=F9ST3K>. The form is available at each school building if you do not have access to it online. If all meals are free, why do we have to complete this form?

School districts receive funding from the state and federal governments. For each learner who would otherwise qualify for free or reduced-price breakfast/lunch, schools receive additional dollars in funding. Even a small increase in completed Household Income Eligibility forms collected results in significantly more money to support our learners and schools.

What if my child doesn't want to eat school breakfast/lunch? Why should I fill out the form?

Even if your child chooses to bring their own breakfast/lunch or snack or if they eat lunch at home, filling out the form is very important! It ensures that our school gets all of the funding and benefits available. Also, even if your child does not eat school breakfast/lunch, learners who would otherwise qualify for free breakfast/lunch can receive benefits, including reduced fees for SAT and ACT tests, reduced college applications fees, discounts on Chromebook Warranty, and discounts on monthly internet services and computer purchases.

How does filling out the Household Income Eligibility Form help our school?

Schools qualify to receive more money per learner from the state and federal government and receive more money in their budgets to support learners.

Our Household doesn't qualify for free or reduced-price meals, do I still need to complete the form?

The information on this form is not shared. If you complete the secure online form, you won't enter the exact household income, only an income range. If you do not wish to be considered for eligibility, you may fill out the paper form by completing the learner information, write "does not qualify" in the income section, and then complete the name, signature, and date lines, and return it to erin.wright@neric.org or to your child's school.

Is the information I submit confidential?

Yes. The information you submit on the Household Income Eligibility Form is not shared by our school. Personal information submitted on the form is not shared with the state or federal government; only the number of learners who would otherwise qualify for free or reduced breakfast/lunch is shared. District personnel are not told which learners would qualify for free or reduced breakfast/lunch benefits. Our school does not share information with other organizations that provide benefits.
